FIRST REPORT Mental Health Resources in the Greater Northridge Community 7/15/2023---12/31/2023

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INTRODUCTION

Laura Westlund created the Westlund Center (TWC) in response to two significant issues: her terminal illness diagnosis in 2021 and her awareness of the unmet mental health needs confronting urban communities.

After considerable inquiries about a suitable urban setting, a unique opportunity was presented in 2022 with the Department of Social Work at California State University, Northridge (CSUN).

Working in collaboration with this Department, TWC would become a Practicum Placement setting for selected first and second-year students to research community mental health needs and services, with the long-term goal of offering "...an innovative Mental Health program to vulnerable members of the Greater Northridge Community (GNC)." (www.thewestlundcenter.org)

Before her passing on 2/23/23, Laura established TWC as a 501 (c)(3) Private Charitable Trust funded by her estate. Funds from her trust would be invested so that TWC could exist perpetually. Profits from those investments would fund the organization's operations, including stipends for the program's interns.

On February 23rd, 2023, she lost her years-long cancer battle. Exercising her selfdetermination right, she took advantage of Washington State's Death with Dignity law and transitioned peacefully, surrounded by friends and neighbors at home.

TWC will continue her decades-long commitment to mental health service through this unique collaboration with the Department of Social Work at CSUN.

PROJECT

For this project, we defined The Greater Northridge Community as a Catchment Area, bound by Freeway's SR-118 on the North, I-405 on the East, I-101 on the South, and Topanga Canyon Blvd on the West.

Within this area, nine cities cover 101.2 square miles with a population of approximately 504,697 people and are represented by 12 different postal zip codes. Not included in this data count were PO Box zip codes.

Since mid-July of 2023, Interns Andrea Godoy and Elijah Salazar Reyes have worked relentlessly to identify mental health organizations' services in the catchment area. Their efforts have resulted in this first of several reports, noting what is available in six categories: **Demographics, Brick-and-Mortar organizations and services, Crisis organizations and services**, **Private Practice providers, Faithbased mental health services**, and **Tele mental health organizations and services**.

While we have confidence in the scope of our organizations/services research, it is nevertheless a work in progress with updates as needed.

DEMOGRAPHICS

The categories selected for this section represent some of the more common 2020 Census Bureau areas of interest. There were dozens of Census Bureau demographic categories we could have chosen. We tried to list those that would provide something of tone and substance to the Northridge catchment area.

For the purposes of this project, we added one of the less common categories (INTERNET USERS) but one of significant interest to us to be identified and developed in section seven (TELEHEALTH).



CRISIS SERVICES INTRODUCTION

Community members experiencing a mental health crisis have several choices, with a call to 911 being the most immediate service option. Such calls are routinely redirected to local police resources for in-person contact and potentially to their own mental health crisis unit. Depending on the nature and severity of the crisis, referrals to local hospital emergency rooms and the national crisis line (988) can be offered.

CRISIS SERVICES

Crises are met in this community by contacting the police, calling the mental health line 988, or walking into the emergency room.

a. Dial 988: 988 is a suicide and crisis lifeline 24/7

b. Dial 911: 911 is an emergency telephone number 24/7

c. The Los Angeles Police Department Devonshire Station is located at 10250 Etiwanda Ave, Northridge, (818) 832-0633. This Station serves Chatsworth, and Northridge, as well as some parts of Canoga Park, Granada Hills, and Winnetka. Devonshire Area covers 48.31 square miles and has a population of 219,136 +.

Some police stations' services include a Mental Evaluation Unit (MEU) as part of the Crisis Response Support Section (CRSS). Only police officers can call to dispatch the MEU.

d. There is one hospital with an emergency room that covers the catchment area. Dignity Health - Northridge Hospital Medical Center, 18300 Roscoe Blvd, Northridge, CA 91325, (818) 885- 8500. The emergency room is open 24/7.

e. For members of the Kaiser Permanente health group, access to their emergency room is part of the subscriber's medical care services. The Kaiser Permanente facility is located at 5601 De Soto Ave. Woodland Hills, CA 91367, (833) 574-2273 (toll free).

PRIVATE PRACTITIONERS' INTRODUCTION

The Private Practice community offers a full range of mental health services on a fee-for-service basis. Depending on the type (individual, couple, family, or group), the service provider's degrees and experience, and location (office, hospital, and/or online), fees can range from \$50 to \$250 or more per session. While most fees are fixed, there are some practitioners who offer a sliding scale. Licensure is mandated for those who offer private practice services.

PRIVATE PRACTITIONERS

There were 115 private practitioners we could identify for the Greater Northridge Community catchment area. Each professional identified themselves as licensed and representing such degrees as CIMHP (Certified Integrative Mental Health Professional), DSW (Doctor of Social Work), LCSW (Licensed Clinical Social Worker), LMFT (Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist), LPC (Licensed Professional Counselor), LPCC (Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor), MA (Master in Arts), MD (Medical Doctor), MS (Master of Science), MFT (Marriage and Family Therapist), MSW (Masters in Social Work), NP (Nurse Practitioner), PH.D (Doctor of Philosophy), PPS (Pupil Personnel Services), PPSC (Pupil Personnel Services Counselor), PsyD (Doctor of Psychology), and SEB (Bachelors of Arts Society).

The majority listed their practice addresses on Roscoe and Zelzah avenues.

There were a number in group practice.

FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND SERVICES INTRODUCTION

We have included the faith-based category in recognition of the vital role faith-based organizations and practitioners play in meeting the MH needs of the urban community.

There is a fundamental difference in the underlying philosophies of faith-based and non-faith-based practitioners providing mental health services.

Faith-based providers ground their approach in believing that human identity is based on an external source such as God's design rather than an individual's feelings or wishes.

Non-faith-based practitioners focus more on individual needs, leading to an internal locus of control.

Our position respects both points of view.

TELE-MENTAL HEALTH

This section has been included to identify the focus of our future research direction. Early in our research, a brief inquiry laid bare the vastness and complexity of such a service, requiring us to devote considerably more time to the heading. Issues such as confidentiality, technology, effectiveness, providers, training, access, populations served, licensing, liability, and administration were but a few of the concerns we identified.

Therefore, with great excitement, we decided to devote the entirety of the Spring semester (2024) to these Tele-Mental Health questions, publishing the results by June 1st, 2024.
